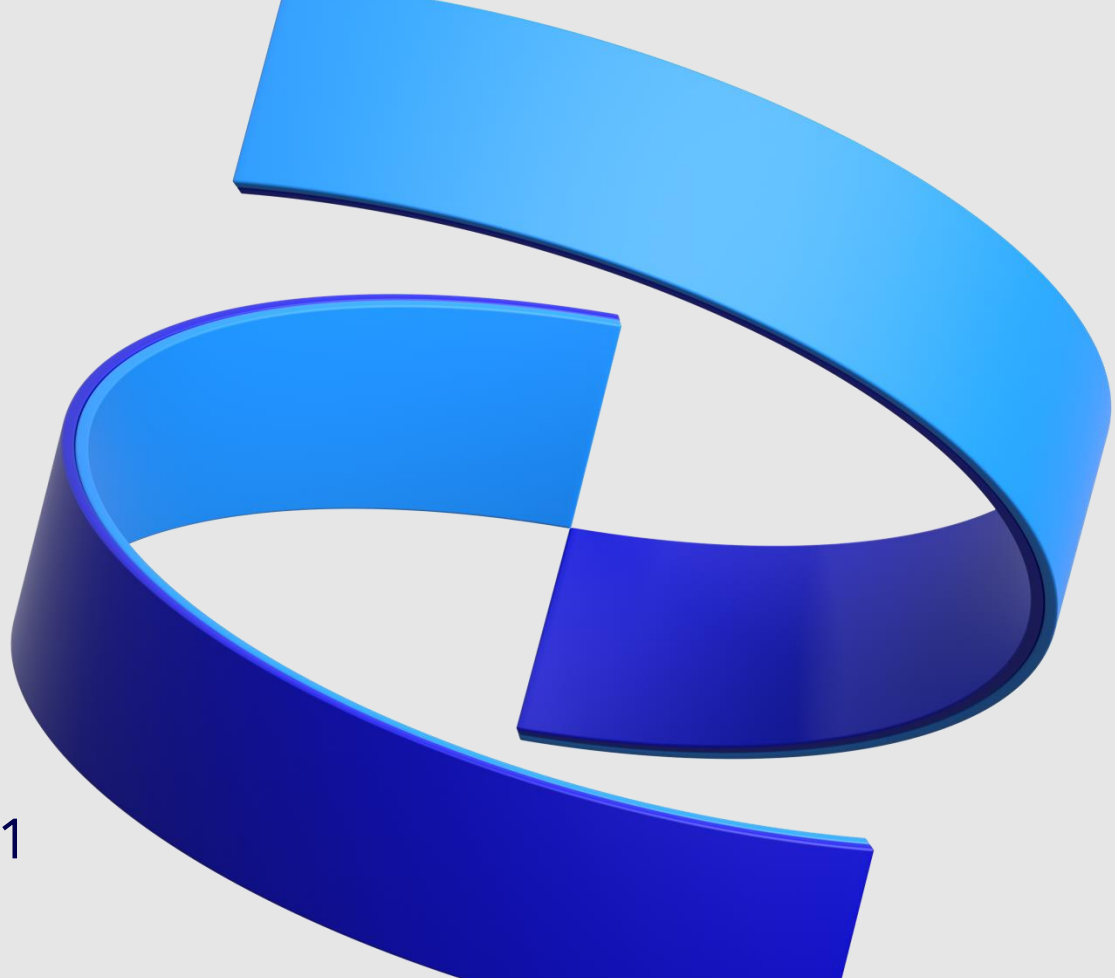

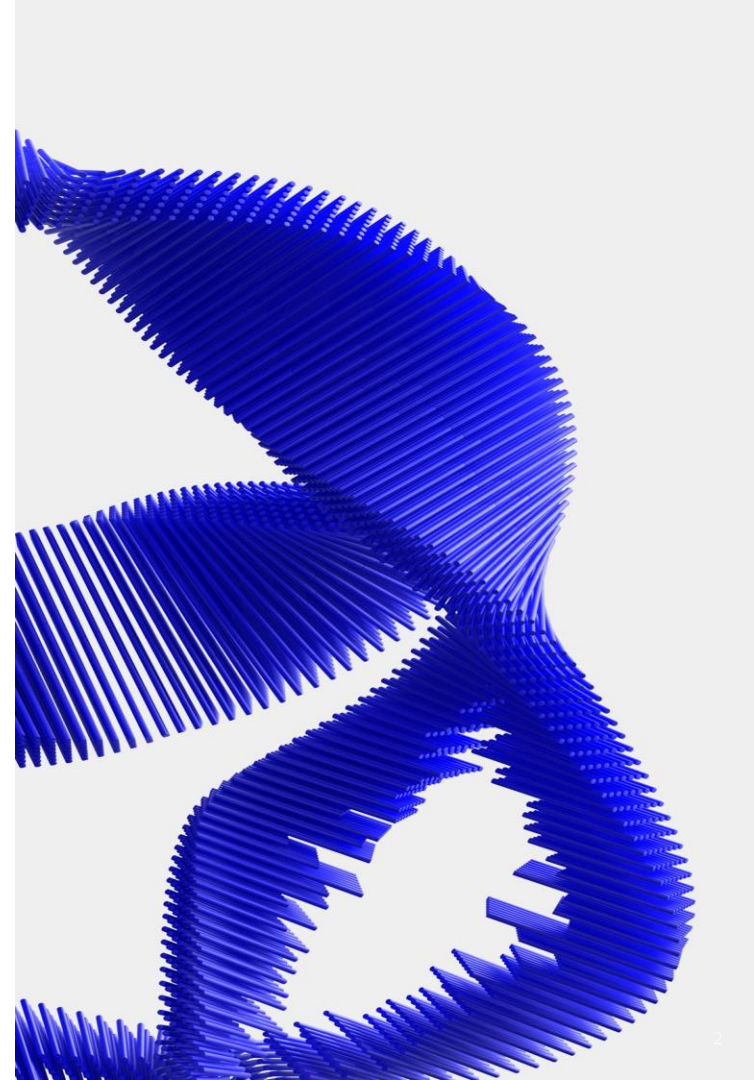

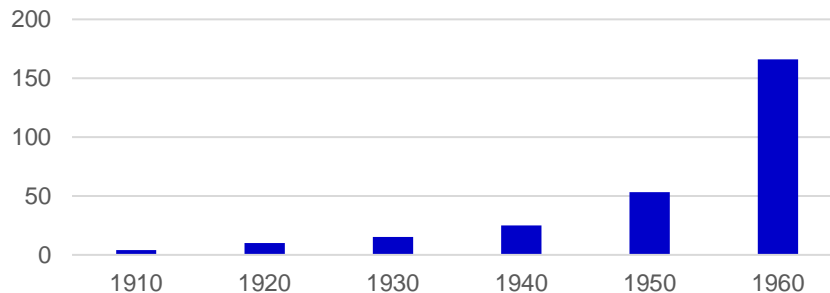


Upjohn Museums

- In 1884 W.E. Upjohn moved his friable pill business from his home garret to Hastings, MI back in 1884
- In 1885 the company moved to the basement of a building in South Burdick Street, Kalamazoo, MI and within a year it bought the building directly back of the building where the basement was located. This became the third location of the company.
- The Upjohn Company had grown into a multinational business by the early 50's and that was also reflected in Upjohn's real estate
- It was decided that that much of a history needed a museum!

15 November 1951

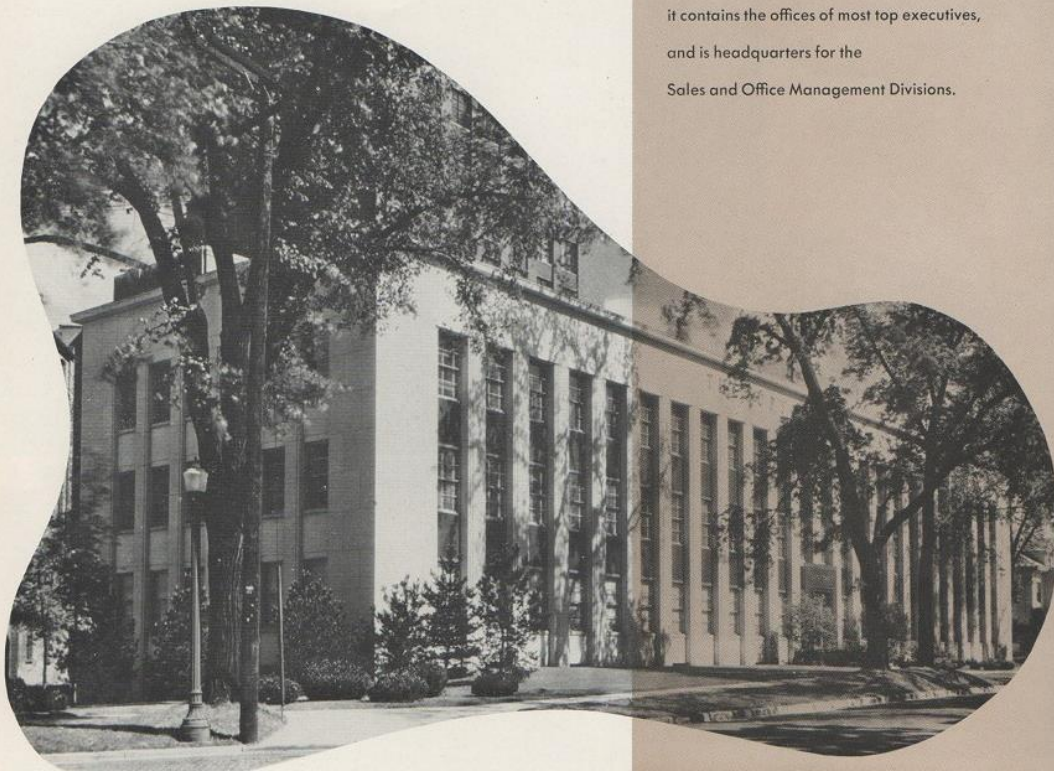
The first formal museum opened at Upjohn in 1951, using a room in Building 24, the executive building in Downtown Kalamazoo.

1935

The office building on Henrietta Street was completed and occupied in October of 1935. A general administrative center, it contains the offices of most top executives, and is headquarters for the Sales and Office Management Divisions.

B24 Museum - How it started

- **Hal Maloney** (Personnel) and **Don Meredith** (Advertising) collected early equipment, product samples and records.
- Labeled and organized the collection in the former products display room in the basement of building 24.
- The museum – a long held idea – became a reality on November 15, 1951 - in Building 24 downtown Kalamazoo



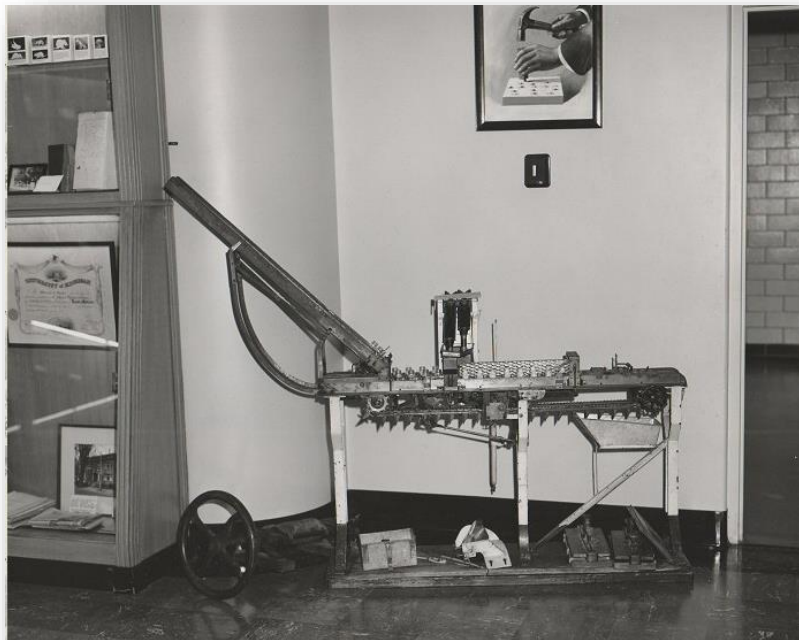
